## HAPPY 100TH BIRTHDAY JOAN

Joan Oakden of Swarkestone Road in our village, Celebrated her 100th Birthday on Saturday 14th of October.

Her day started with many cards, especially 1 from the King and Queen, flowers, plants, bouquets, which included 100 roses from a dear old friend in the village.



The celebrations started in the afternoon with a visit to her home from The African Apostolic Church Choir, who sang for her.

They then moved down to the village hall in Barrow where all her family and friends had gathered to celebrate her birthday.

She was entertained by The Oakden School of Dancing, singing from our family members from Ireland, and finishing with some beautiful singing from Jemma Johnson, a dear friend of the family.

The weekend was finished off nicely with a family meal at The Brookfield on Sunday.

Joan has lived nearly all her life in the village, originally lived at the gate house cottage, her father being the groom to Colonel Edy, the owner of Barrow Hall. The Hall stood where Hall Park is now.



When war broke out, she worked in the Ammunition Factory at Sinfin, she worked after this as a Nanny to a Master at Repton School, it was in Repton where she met her husband, Archie. They married in 1942 at St Wilfrid's Church in the village with the reception at The Club, in Club Lane and they ran between the two with bombs dropping nearby.

Later, they moved into the house that she still lives in, in 1943, that's 80 years in the same family home!

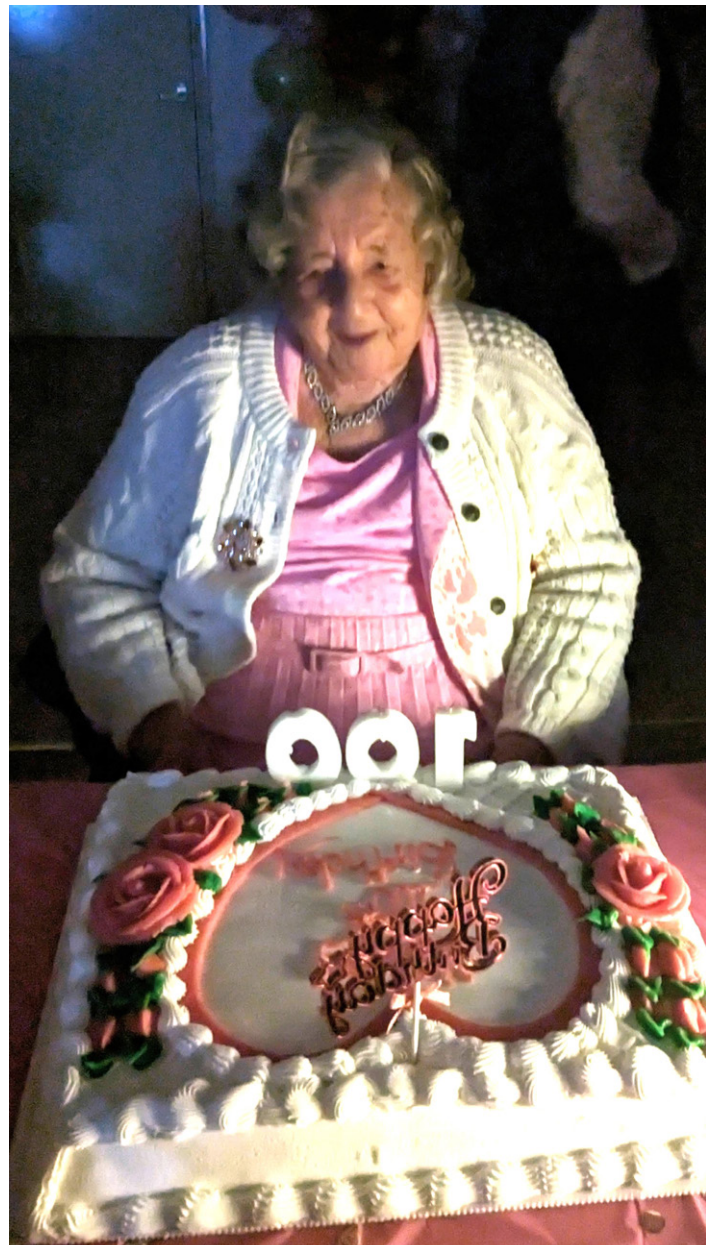


She had a family of four children, when they had all reached school age, took on her new role as a Home Help, working round the area of South Derbyshire, which she did for 25 years.

Sadly lost her husband Archie in 2015, they had been married for 73 years.

Her family has grown over the years, now has 7 Grand Children, 8 Great Grandchildren, and 2 Great Great Grandchildren.

Joan has suffered quite a lot with her health over the last few years, but was determined to reach this landmark of her 100th Birthday.

### **Nominations:**

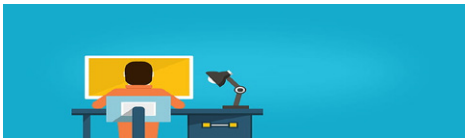
- Should be received by the Clerk by 1st March 2023, with a brief supporting statement to outline the reason for the nomination.

## BARROW ON TRENT VILLAGE HALL COMMITTEES



Season's greetings from the Village Hall Committee, below is our Chair's report (Mrs. Jenny Quibell) - taken from our Annual General Meeting which was held in the Village Hall on Monday 7th November 2023. The report provides an update for 2023.

'During the past year we have endeavoured to maintain and enhance the programme of activities at the village hall. We have a 5 day a week term time Sale and Davys Playgroup and many other activities during the whole of the year. The village hall is used at weekends for parties that cater for people of all ages by families in and outside the local area. We are always seeking to expand the clubs and groups that use the hall to offer a varied activities programme for local people. We make every attempt to keep our hire charges at reasonable rates in order to make the hall available to local people.

Our main programme of work for this year has been to obtain a financial grant from South Derbyshire Communities Grant Fund to enable us to expand the programme of sustainability of the village hall, to which we have been successful. We will be having solar panels fitted to the exterior of the hall along with battery storage facilities. Also, a Hive remote controlled system for heating and hot water management. Emergency pull cord for the disabled toilet and a motion sensor lighting system to be fitted to the storage area. All of these are to provide the village hall with a more modern economical and long-term system of control of all the heating and lighting for the future. Following these improvements, we will be returning to our interior and exterior deep cleaning programme by our professional team in order to keep the village hall in tip top condition.

As a committee, we wish to highlight and offer thanks to Colleen March (Secretary of the village hall) for the hard work she has put into obtaining the grant to enable the improvements to happen. Without her tenacity and dedication this project would not have happened.

Thank you to all those other local people who give their time and commitment to the village hall, it is very much appreciated.

Once again, the committee wish all parishioners a very happy Christmas, and a happy and healthy New Year.

We have received numerous complaints about inconsiderate parking around the village. PLEASE, PLEASE consider access for Prams, Pushchairs & Wheelchairs when you are parking.

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### OVERGROWN SHRUBS AND TREES

These are also causing a problem for people walking with Prams & Wheelchairs. Please ensure you keep your shrubs and overhanging trees trimmed back to leave the full width of the pavement available to all users.

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### CAN YOU HELP?

Very Occasionally we may need help from willing volunteers who when the village is at risk of flood, we can call on to help. We have a flood warden in the village who co-ordinates where and when help is needed but we would be very grateful if some of you would volunteer to help if required.

The Parish Council has an emergency plan that contains names and addresses of people that are vulnerable and who may need extra help. We know it's the individual house owner's responsibility to protect their own property but some of our residents may need a bit of extra help with flood shields, sandbags etc. We may also need help with road barriers/ road closed signs we put near the School & Brookfield to stop people driving through the water, as this causes waves to wash into the nearby properties.

The Parish Council would like to thank everyone who came and helped during the recent flooding. We now have plenty of sandbags at the community park should we need them anytime soon.

We do have a very old list of Volunteers but would like to update it with some new ones please!

## PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

We currently have a full team of Councillors & a Parish Lengthsman Kevin, working to ensure the Parish is a great place to live. Kevin does an amazing job keeping the Parish looking its best, if you see him about, please say hello.

In recent months the Parish Council have continued to review planning applications and comment where necessary. Weekly inspections are carried out around the village by the Councillors and any problems reported. Dog Bins have been fixed, potholes reported, broken streetlights reported along with support to the Arleston residents to help catch & stop fly tipping just to name a few things.

A recent insurance inspection has been carried out on all the trees owned by the Parish Council and 3 or 4 have been highlighted for urgent work. This will be done as soon as the ground is dry enough to allow access.

Along with the Tree Inspection we have also had the Pay Equipment at the Susie Dixon Park inspected by an outside company. This again is for insurance purposes. There were a couple of minor things that need doing and this work will be actioned.

The Allotments have had their trees trimmed and will soon be getting a new fence along one side to tidy the area up. There is still 1 Allotment available to rent if anyone is interested, please contact the Clerk.

The Cemetery is, as always looking good, and thanks must go to everyone who helps make this happen. We welcome your Christmas wreaths and flowers but ask that any you wish to keep removed by the 28th January 2024.

Concern has been raised recently over the continuation of the School Bus from Barrow to Chellaston and we have requested that this route be re assessed to ensure the Bus Service continues especially due to the huge increase in traffic in the area. The Parish Council feels very strongly that this service is essential for the pupils of the school.

The conservation officer from South Derbyshire District Council along with the Head of planning recently visited the village to look at the cottages owned by the Parish Council. The front windows in the cottages are quite rotten in places and we are looking into the best way to replace them. Ideally installing double glazing would be a massive benefit to the tenants but due to the cottages being in the conservation area and being Grade II listed it makes it all a lot more involved. We hope we can get a positive solution going forward.

Recent wet weather saw flood water effecting the village again quite badly. Lots of residents reported drains backing up and problems with toilets etc. The Parish Council have contacted Severn Trent to get the Main Drains investigated, especially the pumping station on Church Lane which we

understand stops working during the flooding. Councillors will be attending the upcoming flood liaison meeting to put forward their concerns to the Environment Agency, South Derbyshire & Severn Trent. The Parish Council would also request that if you own land in the parish with ditches that these all be checked to ensure that they are free flowing, and that no debris has recently been moved by the floods that will cause problems when the water rises again.

**A BIG THANK YOU** to the Hill Farm campsite on Moor Lane who kindly offered use of their shower facilities to the residents of the cottages when the toilets and showers stopped working due to flood water. **Thank you** also to the **Village Hall** who also allowed access to their toilets.

There is a brief report regarding the recent flooding elsewhere in the Parish News, if you can offer your help in future, please let the Clerk know.

The Infinity Garden Village development is still looming in the background and the PC & residents continue to question what is going to happen and when? To date South Derbyshire Planning Authority have not been able to supply us or the District Councillors with any update. We are hoping to get an update soon.

The Excellence in the community award was introduced this year and we are now looking for the next worthy recipient. Please see the details elsewhere in this magazine.

Christmas is fast approaching, and we will have the **“LIGHT SWITCH ON”** at the Brookfield on **Sunday 3rd December 5.45pm for a 6pm** switch on. Please join us for a glass of festive cheer and Mince Pies & Sausage Rolls.

The next Parish Council meeting is on Tuesday 5th December 2023 7pm. Everyone is welcome to attend, come along and have your say or listen to what we are discussing.
