ST WILFRID'S TALKS AND WORKSHOPS

Over the year, there have been many events and workshops for you to join in, organised by Llynda, our Heritage Activities Manager.

These have been really successful, but there are still some events and interesting things still to come this year: On September 1st, Anne Boleyn visited the church to talk about her life with Henry VIII, and her subsequent fall from favour. If you missed this event with Lesley Smith, please don't worry; there will be more characters to come over 2024, along with several heritage talks.

The heritage talks this year will continue until November, including "finding Richard III" from the archaeologist who supervised the excavation.

Several workshops including stone carving and corn dollies, will continue into the autumn.

Further heritage talks will continue next year, including the Anglo-Saxons, and the Viking Great army – these talks will be by Dr Gareth Williams of the British Museum. He has worked on the Saxon Hoard, and the excavation of the Viking burials in Heath Wood across the river valley from Barrow.

ARCHAEOLOGY

The archaeological survey of the church and churchyard using Ground Penetrating Radar took place in May. The results are awaited with bated breath to find out just what is underneath the floor of the church, the churchyard, and the age of the church based upon Astro archaeological data. Please come along on the evening of 29th November to see what the archaeologists discovered.

GEORGE TURNER EXHIBITION

Of special interest to Barrow, a weekend exhibition of paintings by our very own artist, George Turner, who lived in The Walnuts, Church Lane, will be in the church and around the village on the weekend of 16th and 17th of September. Large copies of some of Turner's paintings will be on show in fields and gardens around the village, and there will be an active show in the church of paintings on our large screen.

In addition, we are really pleased to host some live artists who will be demonstrating their skills in and around the church building. There will be cream teas available too - it promises to be a great weekend.

Making pizza

We often engage in cooking or baking activities, teaching maths skills. These include measuring, counting, shapes and space, social skills like turn taking, sharing resources and communication skills - "What happens? Why do you think? Can you describe?"



Small world play and role play

The children use their incredible imaginations to create stories and play scenarios. This helps the children to think about what they know about the world, question the whys, what's and where's, which we actively encourage at Sale and Davy's Playgroup.

Creative

We always have paint, pencils, sticking, water, sand, other materials and media for the children to create and use their fine motor skills, which develops the muscles for writing.

Physical

We offer lots of stimulating activities to develop gross motor skills and keep children active. As well as free flow play inside and outdoors with balancing, dancing, balls and bikes.



Our community

We love to visit and get to know our community; spending time planting and growing in our own allotment. Here we also have access to chickens, horses, swing's, slides, playhouses and a safe space to run and play. We use the fields to host our annual sports day. We visit the Alpacas and cows in the village and occasionally enjoy our snack time al fresco!

BARROW ON TRENT VILLAGE HALL COMMITTEE SEPTEMBER 2023 UPDATE

The Committee hope that we find everyone well and hopefully (at the time of writing) after quite a damp July, a little more sunshine has managed to find its way into late August/September 2023.

The Hall remains is in good order, members of the Committee regularly check if any maintenance work is required and ensure all fire, electrical and gas checks are undertaken annually.

Recently the Committee has applied to South Derbyshire District Council for a grant to supply new Solar Panels to the roof of the Hall, in the hope that this will help reduce rising energy costs in the future.

We are hopeful our application for £12,000 will be approved.

Bookings at the Hall remain consistent with the Hall being regularly used over the weekend periods, along with our Playgroup having weekly sessions during term time.

We are fortunate to have a thriving Village Hall, and would like to remind anyone who may have an upcoming event to think about hiring our hall, charges are very competitive:

£6 per hour for residents living within the Parish

£8 per hour for non-residents

£10 per hour for business usage.

Our Annual General Meeting will be held at 7pm in the Hall on **Monday 9th October**, everyone is invited along to hear our annual update, and we welcome any new ideas and comments/ feedback from residents.

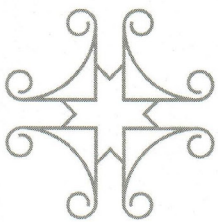

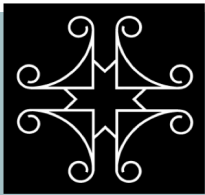
